Year-To-Year Budget Notes

Enrollment

The purpose of this narrative is to describe the overall budget differences between Stoddert Elementary School's FY25 initial allocation and their FY24 budget. Stoddert's FY25 initial formula allocation is \$6,374,719. This is an increase of \$160,792 compared to the FY24 approved budget. The FY24 approved budget includes one-time, non-DCPS model generated funding for Stoddert including \$380,594 in initially allocated Mayor's Recovery funding and \$150,403 in Budget Assistance. The FY24 approved budget also includes \$396,953 in Schools' First in Budgeting supplement funds as awarded by DC Council. For FY25, schools were stabilized to 95% of their FY24 approved budgets which includes any additional Council funds. Any allocated Title I funds were excluded from this comparison for both fiscal years.

School budgets are primarily driven by a few factors: projected enrollment, specific student need, school programming, and position costs. In SY23-24 (FY24), Stoddert's projected enrollment was 451. For SY24-25 (FY25), the school's projected enrollment is 465, an increase of 14 students. Stoddert is receiving 1 more special education educator compared to their FY24 initial allocation, due to a projected increase in the number of students with IEPs. Stoddert is receiving 1 more ML teacher compared to their FY24 initial allocation due to a projected increase in the number of Multilingual Learners. To support the social-emotional and academic needs of at-risk students, schools receive supplemental uniform per-student formula funds (UPSFF). Stoddert is receiving an at-risk UPSFF supplement of \$122,771.

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds were non-recurring, supplemental funds initially dispersed in the 2019-20 school year, to support COVID-19 relief efforts and evidence-based acceleration programming. Last school year, school year 2023-24, was the final year of the ESSER grant award, therefore DCPS schools will not be allocated these funds moving forward.

Levels of Flexibility Key

Level 1 (L1): Required - Locked - These allocations are unable to be changed. This may be determined by fund source requirements and allowability, such as grants and Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs), legal requirements, and other core operational considerations.

Level 2 (L2): Required - Rarely flexible - Any shift in the allocation will maintain the intended purpose of the original allocation. Principals must demonstrate how they will meet related programmatic requirements.

Level 3 (L3): Flexible - These allocations are provided to schools to budget for staff and programming.
